### Healthcare and Sanitation

Our approach to growth is anchored in creating meaningful impact beyond business operations, with a strong focus on community well-being and inclusive development. By integrating social responsibility with strategic expansion, we are building lasting partnerships that enhance quality of life while strengthening our global and local presence.



**Advancing Responsible Global Partnerships**

We have been identified as the preferred partner by the Autonomous Bougainville Government for the reopening and operation of the Panguna copper-gold mine, marking a significant step in our international expansion. The engagement, structured under a services or contract mining framework, reflects confidence in our technical and operational capabilities.

Aligned with our community-first approach, we have also committed to developing a 100-bedded, Level-7 hospital in Arawa, Bougainville. This initiative supports local healthcare access while strengthening partnerships and ensuring that development is aligned with community priorities.



**Addressing Health & Sanitation in & around Ghugus**

With a total investment of ₹3.13 Crore, several health and sanitation initiatives supported 1,28,688 beneficiaries through vital regional interventions. Key efforts included organising 31 health camps, distributing over 700 spectacles, providing medical equipment for the elderly, and deploying a cardiac ambulance. To ensure long-term resilience, the project upgraded local primary health centers and sanitation infrastructure, including toilets and waste management systems. These efforts successfully enhanced primary healthcare access, lowered out-of-pocket medical expenses, and improved maternal and child health metrics.

**Transforming Rural Healthcare Access**

The Lloyds Kali Ammal Memorial (LKAM) Hospital stands as a beacon of accessible and compassionate healthcare for surrounding communities. What was once a region with limited medical access now benefits from quality treatment available locally, free of cost. Equipped with advanced facilities, including an intensive care unit and maternity services, the hospital has significantly improved health outcomes. To date, it has delivered over 2,20,000+ consultations, 3,700+ inpatient admissions, 390+ ICU cases, 1,500+ major surgeries and 390+ safe deliveries. Originally a 30-bedded facility, it has been expanded into a 100-bedded multi-specialty hospital, with plans underway to further upgrade into a super-speciality centre, strengthening its commitment to holistic and inclusive healthcare.

**Strengthening Community and Health Well-being**

Through targeted community initiatives, our Company continues to advance healthcare awareness and support across surrounding villages. Under the 'Sakhi Saheli' programme, over 3,900 adolescent girls and women across 21 villages receive sanitary support alongside menstrual hygiene awareness. Nutritional kits and regular health monitoring are provided to tuberculosis patients in coordination with local health centres. We also conduct sickle cell awareness and screening drives while actively addressing malaria through preventive measures such as mosquito nets, fogging and eco-friendly solutions. Complementary cleanliness campaigns and participation in 'Swachh Gaon' initiatives further promote hygiene and sustainable community well-being.

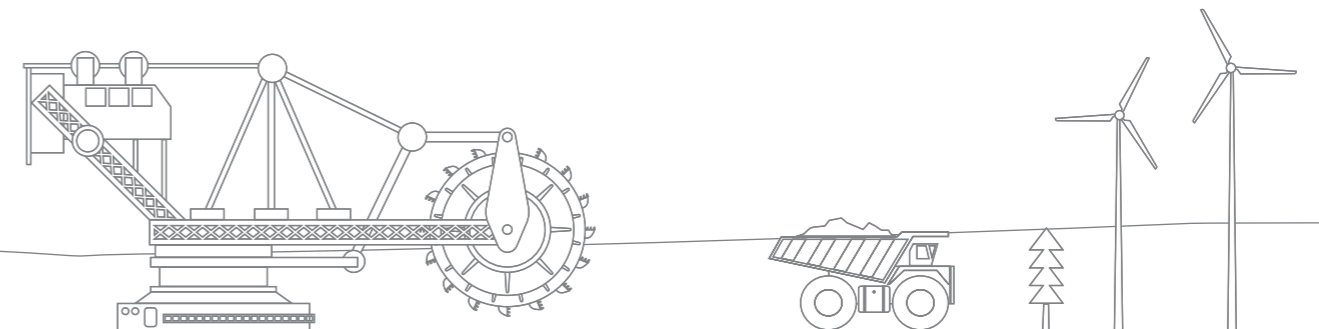

**Advancing Women's Healthcare**

With a strong commitment to safeguarding women's health, an HPV vaccination drive was inaugurated on 9<sup>th</sup> August, 2025 at the Lloyds Kali Ammal Memorial Hospital, Hedri, by LIF Director, Mrs Kirthy Reddy. The initiative is complemented by ongoing awareness programmes addressing cervical cancer, promoting vaccination and dispelling common myths. Led by Shri B. Prabhakaran, Managing Director, Lloyds Metals & Energy Ltd. the programme reflects a proactive approach, with Lloyds Infinite Foundation implementing the drive ahead of the nationwide rollout.

**Education**

Our approach to community development is anchored in expanding access to quality education and enabling inclusive growth across the regions we operate in. By investing in institutions, skills and opportunities, we aim to create long-term pathways for empowerment and socio-economic progress.

**Empowering Communities Through Education**

The University Institute of Technology (UIT), Gadchiroli, is a landmark ₹ 200 crore Public-Private Partnership aimed at transforming technical education in the region. With equal participation from government and industry, the initiative has been accelerated by an initial ₹ 25 crore contribution from our Company. As the district's first engineering institution, UIT focuses on enabling social mobility by equipping local youth with industry-relevant skills. Comprehensive support, including accommodation and study resources, removes financial barriers. With plans to scale to 1,000 students by 2030 and introduce B.Tech programmes from 2026, UIT is aligned with the region's growing industrial opportunities. Established in the previous year by our Company, GD Goenka Public School in Ghugus continued to function effectively during the year under review, providing quality education to local students at subsidised fees. The school witnessed a steady rise in enrolments, reflecting the growing trust and positive response from the surrounding communities towards accessible and quality education.

**Empowering Futures through Inclusive Education**

Educational initiatives across Gadchiroli and Chandrapur are bridging infrastructure gaps and empowering rural youth. In Ghugus, targeted support has reached thousands of students by providing learning materials to 2,662 individuals, higher education scholarships to 107 scholars, and foundational assistance to 649 children through the Light of Life Trust (LOLT). Enhanced by modern Smart Classrooms, computer labs, and vocational training, these programmes run alongside the GD Goenka Lloyds Public School, which delivers state-of-the-art education to over 500 local students. Simultaneously, the Lloyds Raj Vidya Niketan School in Hedri village provides free, CBSE-patterned schooling from Pre-Nursery through Grade XII for underserved tribal communities in Gadchiroli.

**Empowering Youth through Global Education**

With the commencement of full-scale operations at the Surjagad iron ore mines, we have placed strong emphasis on driving sustainable and inclusive development in the Gadchiroli region. At the heart of this vision is the Lloyds Infinite Foundation's commitment to nurturing the potential of local youth. Through targeted outreach, the Foundation identifies motivated students with the aspiration to learn, grow and contribute to their communities.

To enable global exposure, the Foundation launched the "Lloyds Curtin Fully Sponsored Educational Programme" in collaboration with Curtin University, Perth. To date, 24 students from Gadchiroli have been fully sponsored, with comprehensive support covering tuition, living expenses and associated costs. With an annual investment of approximately ₹ 50 lakh per student, this initiative empowers future leaders, fostering socio-economic transformation in the region.

**Driving Awareness through Community Cinema**

The Lloyds Travelling Cinema initiative is bringing a unique blend of education, awareness and entertainment to the villages of Etapalli. Inaugurated by Mrs Kirthy Reddy, Director – Lloyds Infinite Foundation, the programme transforms village evenings into shared community experiences under the open sky. Through a curated selection of impactful and engaging films, the initiative fosters dialogue on social issues while offering accessible entertainment.

Screenings of films addressing themes such as health, gender and social change have encouraged greater awareness and openness at the grassroots level. Communities are increasingly engaging in conversations around topics once considered sensitive, reflecting a shift towards progressive thinking and collective action. The travelling cinema has reached several villages and continues to expand its footprint, strengthening community bonds.

In addition to film screenings, the platform is utilised to promote awareness on key health issues, including tuberculosis, maternal care, nutrition, sickle cell disease and cancer, contributing to informed and healthier communities.

### Women Empowerment

We empower individuals and strengthen livelihoods through inclusive and sustainable interventions. By enabling skill development, creating employment opportunities and supporting entrepreneurship, we aim to build self-reliant communities that can participate meaningfully in economic growth.

#### Empowering Women through Livelihoods

The Lloyds Vanya Clothing Company is a testament to the power of women. Over 450 local women have been trained and initially employed at Lloyds Vanya Clothing Co., producing high-quality garments and fostering financial independence and local entrepreneurship. Recognising the potential for further career growth and acknowledging limitations in salary increase within the garment unit, the Foundation actively supported workers interested in exploring opportunities in other areas of our Company. This initiative has facilitated career shifts for nearly 300 women, who have transitioned to various departments within the mining and plant operations, demonstrating a commitment to long-term career development and expanded economic opportunities.

### Strengthening Communities through Outreach and Livelihood Activities

Acting as a vital bridge between communities and essential services, trained Outreach Workers (ORWs) operate across 15 LIF Outreach Centres, positively impacting 25 villages. They play a key role in raising awareness on government schemes, facilitating access to healthcare services, and promoting self-reliance through targeted livelihood initiatives. Under the kitchen garden programme, pesticide-free vegetables are procured directly from local farmers, supporting incomes across multiple villages.

To encourage women-led entrepreneurship, a Kadaknath poultry initiative has trained 25 Self-Help Group members, yielding over 800 birds to date. Skill-building programmes in beekeeping, solar-powered irrigation support for farmers, and fishery development through fingerling distribution have further strengthened rural livelihoods. Additionally, initiatives such as integrated mango farming and the formation of women-led Self-Help Groups are enhancing income generation and sustainable agricultural practices. Collectively, these efforts are fostering economic resilience, benefiting over 800 individuals while promoting long-term community development.



### Skill Development

We are enabling livelihood opportunities for women through targeted skill development initiatives. During the year, we conducted a 45-day residential Light Motor Vehicle (LMV) driver training programme for women from Konsari village at the Ashok Leyland Institute for Driving Training & Research.

The programme trained 19 participants in driving and safety, enhancing employability and supporting financial independence. It also contributes to improving workforce participation in the region.

### Transforming Lives through Local Employment

A positive transformation is underway in Gadchiroli, driven by strong collaboration between the government, local communities and our Company. Reinforcing this vision, leadership has emphasised rehabilitation through skills and employment, turning local potential into a catalyst for sustainable progress. Moving beyond financial assistance, our Company has enabled long-term livelihoods by employing 68 surrendered Maoists and 14 affected family members across functions such as administration, civil works and operations. These initiatives demonstrate how meaningful employment can foster social stability, support national priorities and create a pathway for enduring peace and inclusive regional development.

We also organised the Gadchiroli District Premier League 2025 as part of our CSR commitment to community development and youth empowerment. Held from January 19 to 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2025 at the district stadium, the tournament featured seven competitive teams and was inaugurated by Ravi Shastri. The initiative promoted sportsmanship, nurtured emerging talent and provided a platform for constructive engagement, reflecting our Company's focus on holistic development and social upliftment in the region.



### Infrastructure Development

We continue to strengthen rural infrastructure and improve quality of life by ensuring access to essential services. Safe drinking water has been prioritised through the installation of RO units, hand pumps and solar-powered overhead tanks benefiting thousands across multiple villages. Investments in community infrastructure include the development of a market yard, construction and renovation of community halls and extensive rural road connectivity to ensure all-weather access.

Further, over 700 LED streetlights have been installed to enhance safety and visibility while pond rejuvenation projects have improved water storage capacity and created shared community spaces. Collectively, these initiatives are fostering sustainable development, improving living standards and strengthening connectivity across surrounding villages.



### Other Initiatives

The Lloyds Sports Academy (LSA) is cultivating a strong sporting culture by training around 570 young athletes across disciplines such as athletics, archery, football and kabaddi. Guided by 17 national-level coaches, participants have secured over 175 medals at district, state and national levels, reflecting the academy's impact. Building on this success, we plan to develop a state-of-the-art 23-acre sports facility in Hedri, aimed at enhancing training infrastructure and unlocking greater potential among local youth.

#### Promoting Grassroots Sports and Youth Engagement

We have strengthened our commitment to community development by supporting the Open 60 kg Kabaddi Tournament in Konsari. Our Company not only sponsored the event but also extended technical and operational support to ensure its smooth execution. The tournament witnessed enthusiastic participation, showcasing local talent and fostering a strong spirit of sportsmanship. Such initiatives play a vital role in encouraging youth engagement, nurturing grassroots talent and building stronger community connections.
